To Northwest Missouri CIT Council Participants:

You are receiving this letter because you initially expressed interest in your department being involved in the Northwest Missouri CIT Council. As a member of the Northwest Missouri CIT Council you are displaying your department's commitment to better serve our community by ensuring your officers have the tools they need when working with individuals experiencing behavioral health issues. Our council has been going strong for the last two and a half years. In that time we have created strong collaborative relationships across law enforcement, mental health providers and service providers. Collectively, we have worked hard to put together our CIT training and to date we have trained 57 officers. We are now excited to be able to offer free CIT trainings annually to Northwest Missouri law enforcement twice a year.

As CIT continues to develop across the state, Missouri CIT has requested that each council develop standards of participation to ensure that accurate information is being provided to our legislators on how CIT is progressing. In an effort to comply with this request, the Northwest Missouri CIT Council has voted to institute a standard of participation. As outlined in the revised bylaws, departments will be required to participate in 50% of meetings (6) annually as of January 1, 2018. Our meetings take place the second Wednesday of every month at 9:00am and are held at either Missouri Western State University or Family Guidance Center. A notice will be sent out each month noting where the meeting will take place that month and the conference call number. Departments are welcome to participate in person or by phone. Departments who are unable to meet this requirement will be listed as inactive on the list of participating departments that is provided to Missouri CIT, legislators and media. Please let us know if your department is interested in participating in the CIT Council but is unable to meet this standard of participation for any reason.
