Report of the Executive Committee		
New Business: a. Definition of CIT Council -Two CIT maps were distributed (CIT map April 2014 and CIT map Jan 2016)	There was discussion about what constitutes a council.	Review definition of a CIT Council referred to the <i>Crisis Intervention Team Program Model</i> document. This will be discussed at the next meeting.

CIT Website</p>	<p>Question 1: If an area is providing a training, but not meeting, should the area be colored blue on the map?</p> <p>Question 2: If an area is meeting regularly but goes to other areas to be trained, should they be considered a council.</p> <p>Katie Horstman provided demo:  <a href="http://www.missouricit.org">www.missouricit.org</a></p>	<p>The consensus for question 1 is no. A council must meet regularly to be considered a council.</p> <p>The consensus for question 2 is yes. As long as an area is meeting, it should be considered a council.</p> <p>Committee members were encouraged to submit resources &amp; links, videos, photos, etc. We want to make each page reflect the individual council and we want to have as much content as possible on the website by the CIT Conference.</p> <p>Katie will add the 2016 Training Resources Document to the website.</p>
<p>c. CIT Logo</p>	<p>There was discussion about revising the MOCIT logo. The Council agreed that the logo should be updated. The slogan should also be changed to reflect the partnership between law enforcement and community members.</p>	<p>Mike Joyce will ask his brother to design.</p> <p>We are hoping to have 3 designs by the conference. We are hoping to have people vote on their preference at the conference. The final selection will be made by the MOCIT Council.</p>
<p>d. CIT Pins</p>	<p>There was a discussion about creating a new CIT pin that all law enforcement could wear. The idea is to have a police badge and a sheriff's badge to be more inclusive.</p>	<p>Mike Joyce will ask his brother to design a generic pin that can be used statewide. Ideas for the new logo include having both the police and sheriffs logos combined.</p>

e. CIT Database of Officers Trained	Discussion regarding a database and the purpose of having individual officer names in addition to just numbers of law enforcement trained. For future funding opportunities the committee felt it would be beneficial for the Coalition to create and maintain a database.	Christine will reach out to POST and will also send an email request to each Council for a list of names.
f. Changing the Location of MO CIT Meetings	Committee members felt that it would be a good idea to rotate the meeting locations to increase participation. Rotating locations would work best during the summer months.	We will create a standardized form for Councils to report the number of law enforcement trained in the future.  The May 24 <sup>th</sup> meeting will be in Columbia. We will try to secure a location in Springfield, MO to host the July 12 <sup>th</sup> meeting.

a. Update, web-based CIT Reporting System Project	Sgt. Romo met with Highway Patrol on Monday. At this time, they were noncommittal.	Legislation may be required for sharing of information.
b. MoCIT State Conference	The 2 <sup>nd</sup> annual conference will be held March 29 <sup>th</sup> in Columbia, Missouri. We currently have 408 confirmed registrations. We have secured an overflow hotel (Drury Inn).  A total of 6 scholarships were awarded for the conference. Each CIT Council has a total of 2 complimentary registrations. d. Core Curriculum	<p>Curriculum committee met February 22<sup>nd</sup>. The group includes both law enforcement and mental health personnel.</p> <p>The proposed curriculum was handed out.</p>	<p>The next meeting is scheduled for March 30<sup>th</sup>. We are requesting that one law enforcement officer and one mental health professional per council attend.</p> <p>It was suggested that we create a release form for the POST presentations so there isn't any issue with sharing the presentations.</p> <p>We are also going to hold curriculum meetings after the council meetings in place of the conference meetings.</p>
e. Fundraising	<p>It was noted that DMH is an important funding source for CIT. However, we are hoping to secure additional funding for next year. What are the fundraising goals?</p> <p>What grant opportunities are available?</p>	<p>Remove Dar Walker from fundraising committee.</p> <p>The decision was to remove fundraising from the strategic plan and to discuss it at the strategic planning meeting.</p>

	<p>There was discussion about people being able to donate on the new website.</p> <p>Is tax exempt status required for the Council to receive donations?</p>	<p>I did follow up with the Coalition financial person. The Coalition is tax exempt and we can receive donations so the CIT Council doesn't need to make a change. We will look into putting a link on the website.</p>
